

### TEAS Prep Seminar Registration

South Plains College offers the TEAS 7 Prep Seminars to assist the nursing student candidate in preparing for the TEAS 7 Examination. Passing the TEAS 7 is one admission requirement to nursing programs at South Plains College.

The Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) is a multiple-choice assessment of basic academic knowledge in reading, mathematics, science, and English/Language Usage. The objectives assessed on the TEAS exam are those which nurse educators deemed most appropriate and relevant to measure entry-level academic readiness of nursing program applicants. The TEAS Prep Seminar will have five separate sessions and the candidate may choose to attend all or one of the seminars.
